The veterans gathered in a room and enjoyed coffee before the start of the event. Then they were led out through one door and in through another as they were walked past a hallway filled with children waving American flags.

Several of the children then gathered to say the *Pledge of Allegiance*, and they were joined by everyone in attendance.

The children then sang two songs *You're A Grand Old Flag* (1906) and *This Land Is Your Land* (1944).

Then, each veteran in attendance was presented with a small flag by a child. In some cases, the flags were presented by their children and grandchildren, and in other instances, they were presented by random children who eagerly accepted the mission.

The children also told veterans what they learned "veterans" are.

"Veterans are people who protect us from mean guys," was one answer.

Another student announced that "Veterans protect our homes."

Suber said the children and everyone are thankful for veterans who served to protect the country. Not only was every veteran recognized, but family members who are left at home were also recognized.

Frank Pitts, who was in the United States Army for six years and the United States Air Force for 14 years was among the veterans recognized. Vicky Pitts was recognized as Suber announced those names of family who stayed home, and Vicky Pitts announced Suber's name as one of those people too.

AmVets Post 42 Cmdr. Jim Hess told the hosts that he and the other veterans appreciate the honors they bestowed upon them.
