Williston City councilman takes oath of office

WILLISTON – Kori Lamb took the oath of office Tuesday night (Nov. 22) as Levy County Court Judge J.T. “Tim” Browning administered it. The new City Council member’s wife Kim Lamb stood nearby.

Councilman Lamb is filling the unexpired term of Levy County Commissioner Matt Brooks as Brooks accepted his new duties when he was sworn in earlier on the same day in Bronson.

Lamb’s seat is one of the three that is going to be up for voters to decide who will fill it in the city’s next election, which is scheduled for March 7 from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

The two other Williston City Council members whose seats are up for voters to decide are the seats currently occupied by Councilman Elihu Ross and Councilman Danny Etheridge.

Among the first actions Lamb took in his first City Council meeting as a leader was to make a motion to adopt Resolution 2016-78, which relates to the approval of the PACE program within the city limits. This program is a financial program for people who may not otherwise qualify for loans to improve their

property, especially in regard to making it more energy efficient.

While the city accepts no liability for the loans and it is under no obligation in regard to the program, the city leaders did unanimously allow three different companies to provide financial opportunities. This program was created by laws enacted by the Florida Legislature.

City Councilman Lamb said he is thankful to be given this opportunity to serve the residents and visitors of Williston.
