Chapter 30 Gives To LARC

It was on this fateful Tuesday morning (Jan. 24) six years later when Darrell Cothron, the final chapter president, presented the last check to LARC. This check for \$407.47 was what was left in the coffers, former President Cothron said, when the chapter chose to end itself at the last meeting. Most members will keep riding, and some will be joining Blue Knights Florida 1. The Blue Knights International Law Enforcement Motorcycle Club is a non-profit fraternal organization consisting of active and retired law enforcement men and women who enjoy riding motorcycles. The Florida Chapter 30 riders have given thousands of dollars to LARC over the years, and Cothron said this is where the group chose to present its final donation. This check presentation was unplanned and unannounced, and it just so happened that one member of the press was there to capture the historic moment.
