BRONSON -- The University of Florida's Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences (IFAS) through the Levy County Agricultural Extension Service presents facts of climate change supported by documented geological evidence.

The potential impact on agriculture and horticulture, in general, are scheduled to be discussed at this free program that is open to the general public.

Facilitators of this program are UF/IFAS Levy Extension Commercial Agriculture Agent Anthony Drew and James E.T. Channell, Ph.D., geologist (retired), University of Florida.

Dr. Channell has the unique ability to present the scientific facts of climate change, a complex phenomenon, with clarity so that laymen can understand the process.
