Levy County Emergency Management seeks input about flooded roads

BRONSON -- Levy County Emergency Management posted a notice for people to report flooded roads.

As a result of an abnormally high volume of rain recently, some areas of Levy County have shown flooded roadways.

This can be a challenge. Motorists are reminded that if there appears to be a flow of water across a road, "Turn around. Don't drown."

Flowing water is a powerful force that can move vehicles off of roads and into ditches, or into deeper bodies of water where the flow is going.

"If you come across a roadway that is flooded, please let us know," Levy County Emergency Management personnel noted on Thursday afternoon (July 26). "You can contact the Levy County Road Department at 352-486-5124. Currently we have been made aware of some significant flooding along roads in Inglis and Yankeetown, especially along Levy County Road 40."
