LEVY COUNTY -- The National Weather Service has issued a flood warning for the Suwannee River near Wilcox at U.S. Highway 19, Levy County Emergency Management Assistant Director David Peaton, FPEM, noted in an 8:03 a.m. email on Monday Dec. 17).

The river is expected to rise steadily during the next several days, and it could begin to cut off roads that are prone to flooding.

Residents and visitors along the Suwannee River, especially areas that are near the river in Fanning Springs should monitor river levels very closely and take necessary protective measures early.
